

### Extreme Weather Emergency Procedures for Marching Band

If practice is already inside, standard school severe weather emergency procedures will be followed.

If practice is outside in front of school, students will be moved inside and standard school severe weather emergency procedures will be followed.

If practice is at stadium, and bad weather has not yet hit but seems imminent, students will be ushered back to the school at directors' judgment. If severe weather hits close to when practice would be ending, but directors deem it is safe for students to leave, those with access to transportation shall be dismissed. All other students that would have to wait for a ride will be ushered either into the tower (depending on number of students remaining) or into the lower rooms of the home side of the stadium (alumni room, locker rooms, hallways, and/or restrooms on the upper level if necessary).

If directors deem that it is not safe for students to leave, then all students will be ushered into the stadium lower level until the weather clears enough that they may leave safely.

Directors will ensure that at least one key is available during outside practices to access the stadium lower level. If inclement weather appears imminent, door shall be kept unlocked during practice. At least one director or parent chaperone shall remain with waiting students until all students have left. At least one director will remain on school property (may be moving equipment to safety if not with students) until all students have been taken care of.

In the event of a serious crisis, a phone tree will be organized via cell phones and using the spirit parents and P.R.O. parents to relay critical information as needed. These cell phone numbers will be collected by the head spirit parent and secretary (from spirit parents and health forms) on an annual basis and distributed to the Directors, the Vice President of Marching Band and a copy kept with the band nurse's supplies.
